INTRODUCTION

In accordance with foreign policy guidelines and priorities established by the current Government, Brazilian technical cooperation has increased, intensified and strengthened the country's presence in the South-South context. The emphasis on cooperation between developing countries, also known as horizontal cooperation, or South-South cooperation, not only results in a greater inclusion of countries benefiting from Brazilian government actions in different continents, such as Africa, South America and the Caribbean, Oceania and Asia, but also in the diversity of national partners involved. These include, not only traditional cooperation institutions, such as EMBRAPA, FIOCRUZ, FARMANGUINHOS, SENAI, SEBRAE, but also representatives from the private sector, civil entities, especially, Non-governmental Organisations (NGOs).

In addition to traditional areas of interest, such as agriculture, education, technical training and qualification, the environment and health, Brazil has increasingly provided cooperation on issues that have become of pressing contemporary importance, such as the prevention of child labour and other areas involving social violence, as well as in matters related to the restoration of citizenship, with projects developed in the area of digital inclusion.

New issues, such as bio-fuels/ethanol, are now included in the cooperation activities offered to developing countries, which have similar problems to those in Brazil and where the know-how and techniques developed or adapted in this country may be assimilated at a low cost and with a high degree of success.

In this context, this publication aims to describe technical cooperation projects that Brazil has carried out, through the Brazilian Cooperation Agency – ABC, in developing countries, divided by continent and country, so as to provide an overall view of the wide spectrum of Brazilian activities in this area. With this aim in mind, projects already in progress are listed, together with their objectives, the institutions involved in carrying out and coordinating these projects, as well as the relevant funding provided by Brazil.

During the last few years, and without neglecting other regions, the Brazilian Cooperation Agency - ABC has concentrated its efforts in Latin America and, in particular, in South America. To this end, there are presently 119 projects being carried out in different areas of interest, in Argentina, Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Guyana, Paraguay, Peru, Suriname, Uruguay, and Venezuela.

There are 22 cooperation projects presently being carried out in Central America, in conjunction with Belize, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Panama. In the Caribbean, there are 58 different activities being carried out between Barbados, Cuba,

Haiti, Jamaica and the Dominican Republic and Basic Cooperation Agreements have been signed, since 2005, with various English-speaking Caribbean countries: Saint Lucia, the Community of the Bahamas, Saint Kitts & Nevis, Antigua & Barbuda, Dominica, Saint Vincent & the Grenadines and Grenada, and projects already established with Barbados, Jamaica and Trinidad & Tobago have been increased.

On the African Continent, in addition to traditional cooperation projects with Portuguese-speaking countries, Brazilian cooperation has been extended to include the continent almost in its entirety, reflecting the importance being given to this region by the current Government of Brazil, as underlined by the opening of new embassies and official visits by the President of the Brazilian Republic as well as by the Minister of State, which have done much to establish closer and stronger bilateral relations in the region.

In Africa, 125 cooperation projects are being carried out in different areas, covering a wide range of issues, such as measures taken to treat and to prevent the occurrence of malaria, tropical agriculture, the environment, good government and the strengthening of State institutions, food safety programmes, the manufacture of handcrafts, electoral training, biofuels, the management and handling of solid residues, the construction of cisterns and the collection of rainwater, amongst others.

Countries receiving South-South cooperation include: Angola, Algeria, Benin, Botswana, Burkin Faso, Cape Verde, Cameroon, Egypt, Gambia, Guinea-Bissau, Mali, Morocco, Mozambique, Namibia, Nigeria, Kenya, San Tome & Principe, Senegal, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

In Asia, Brazilian cooperation has been present in East Timor, even before its independence, with projects in areas such as professional qualification, business training and social progress; the transfer of coffee production know-how; community literacy programmes; long-distance teacher training and programmes student classes via television courses (Telecurso); business and management training; cooperation in HIV/AIDS, and support to strengthen the Justice system.

In the Middle East, 7 initiatives have been developed with Lebanon, involving projects to reconstruct the country.

The Brazilian government expects South-South Cooperation to continue to grow during the coming years, and that this should become an important instrument of foreign policy, to bring Brazil closer to developing countries. The main purpose of Brazilian cooperation is to contribute, as rapidly and effectively as possible, towards the social and economic development of partner countries, since its main aim is to help strengthen the recipient country's national institutions, and should not, therefore, be tied to, or be used in any form as a pre-investment, or be linked to any commercial objective since such cooperation is directed by the principle of partnership being used for development.

This publication, which has been prepared with information provided by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency - ABC, proposes to present a wide view of Brazilian activities in South-South cooperation, so as to promote a greater understanding of the efforts being made by Brazil in favour of developing countries.

Note: International technical cooperation, on its operational level, is carried out by means of projects defined according to specific objectives, carried out one at a time and according to demand, the degree of complexity depending on time restrictions, the number of persons and funding involved. A specific technical cooperation action or activity may involve a single individual, for a relatively short period, such as a week, or be carried out by large teams, during an extended period.

This is why it is necessary to make the distinction between an **isolated activity** and a **project**. The first is an instrument created with a well-defined and specific objective, which is complete in itself, a precise undertaking, which aims to meet one single demand, with a reduced budget. It is not linked to any other activity, is less complex, on a small scale and lasts a short period of time.

The second form of cooperation – called a **project** – is an operational working unit of cooperation activities, by which means external funding is transformed into a joint fund to be used for a single objective, organised and programed to meet previously identified requirements.

In accordance with the United Nations Programme, all projects should include a time limit by which the desired results should be achieved, as well as a working plan, a funding program and an estimate of costs involved.

CARRIED OUT BY BRAZIL**



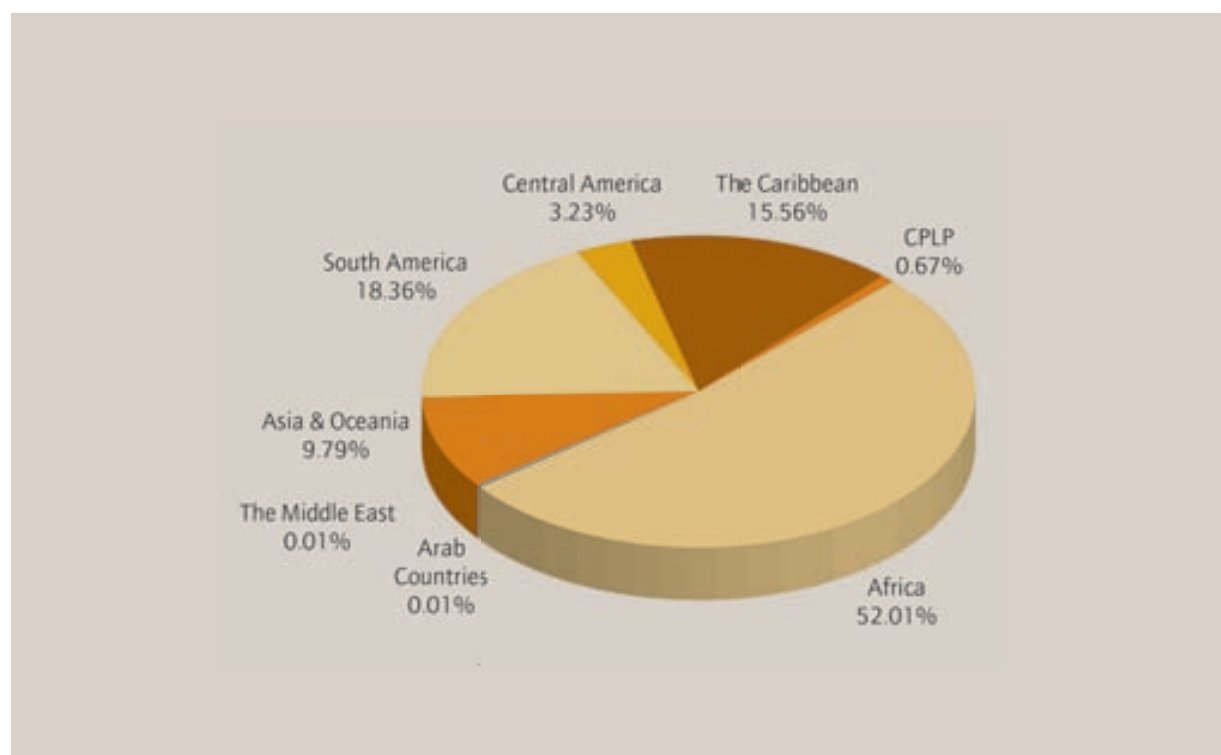

COOPERATION ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT BY BRAZIL BY CONTINENT (%)



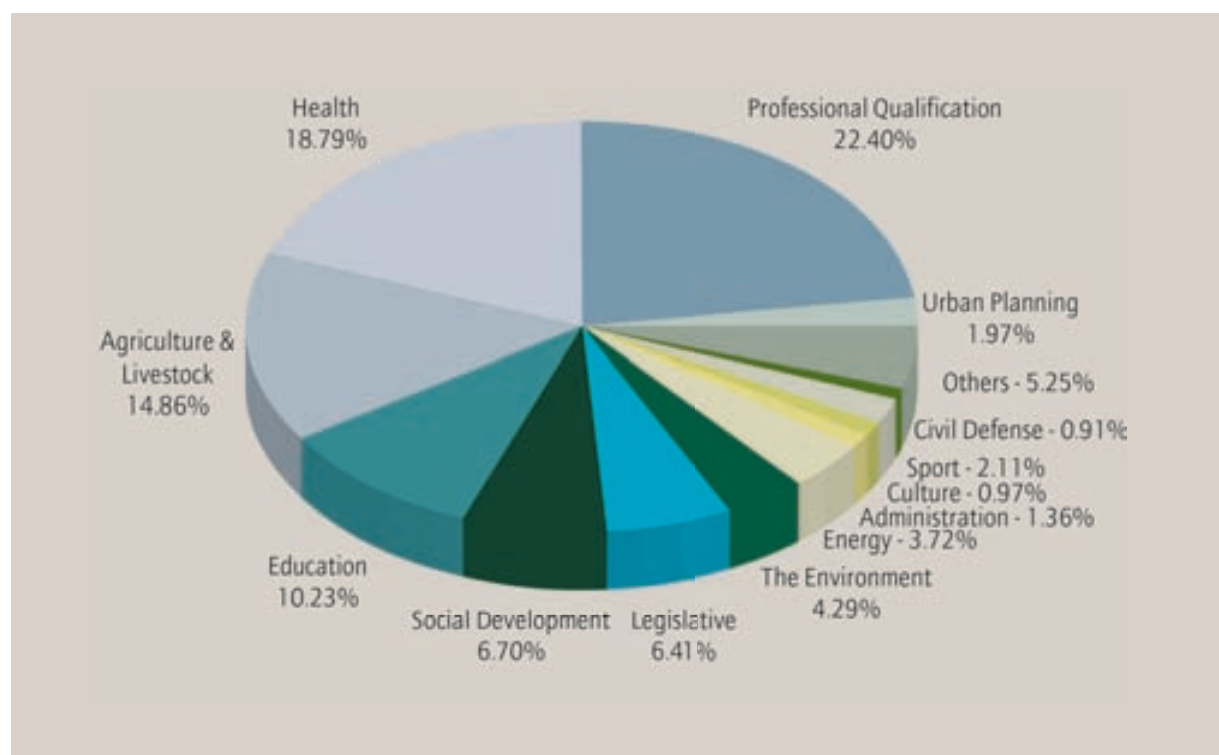

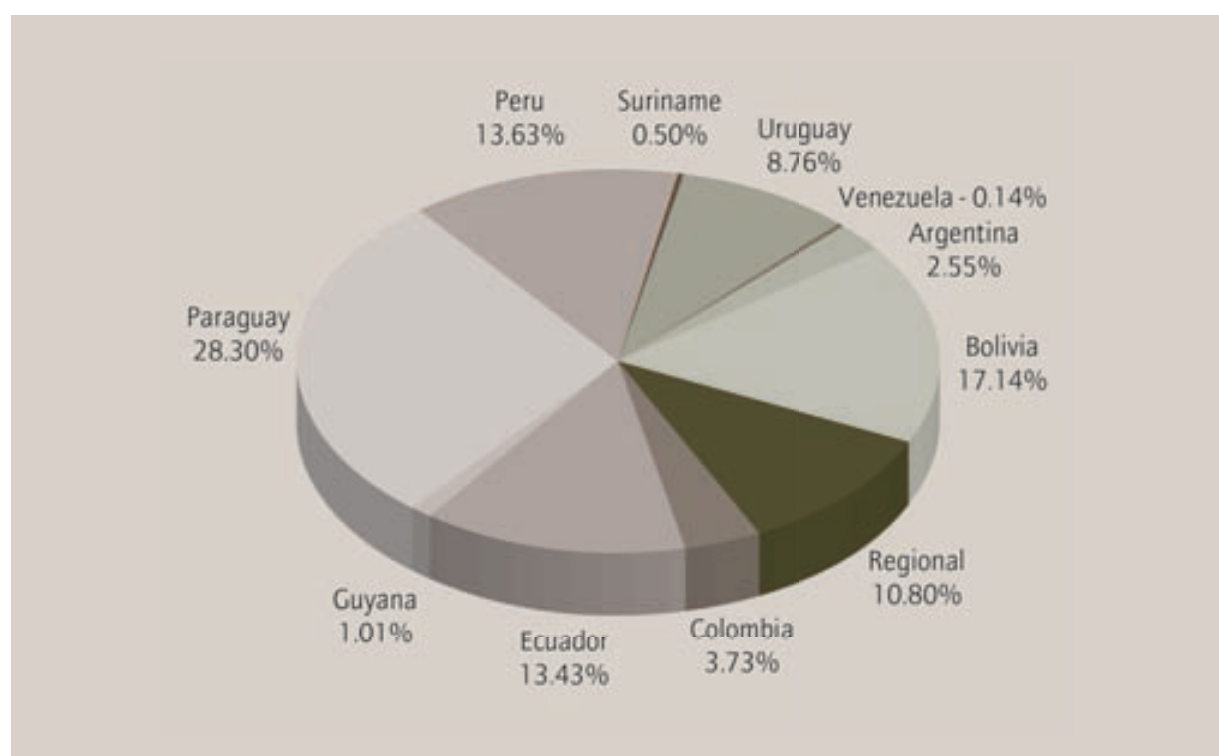

COOPERATION ACTIVITIES IN SOUTH AMERICA BY COUNTRY (%)



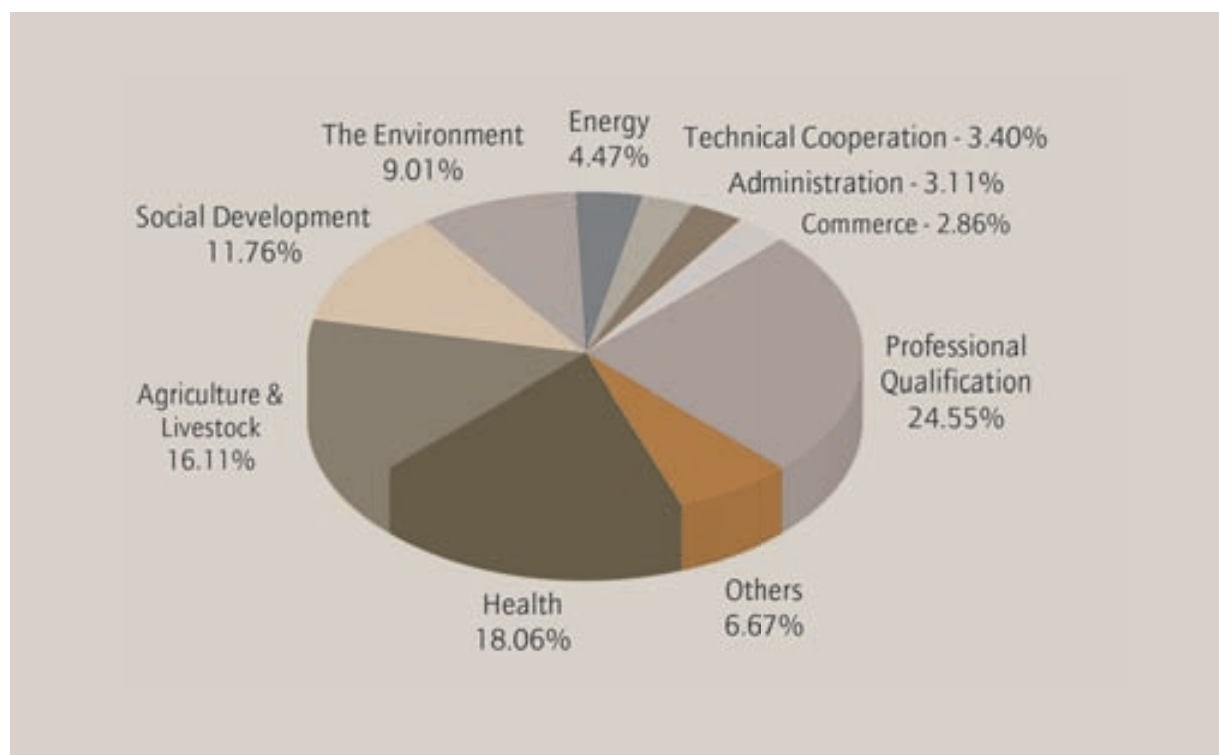

ACTIVITIES / ARGENTINA

1) Exploratory Mission of experts at EMBRAPA Vegetable Production Research sector (Brasilia-DF) and the EMBRAPA Semi-Arid sector (Petrolina-PE) with the aim of preparing Brazil-Argentina technical co-operation projects in Haiti. This project, which is being coordinated by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and carried out by the Brazilian Agricultural and Livestock Research Corporation (EMBRAPA), on behalf of Brazil, and by the Ministry of Foreign Relations of Argentina, aims to identify possibilities for Brazil-Argentina technical cooperation in Vegetable Production and the construction of water cisterns to benefit Haiti. Brazilian funding towards this project amounts to US\$ 2,025.66. **(A)**

2) Exploratory Mission to investigate Opportunities for Brazilian Technical Cooperation in the Manufacturing Area of Diagnostic & Reactive Kits. With Brazilian funding for this project amounting to US\$ 2,420.00, this mission aims to identify areas with the potential to train technicians in the manufacturing division of diagnostic and reactive kits. In addition to the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), other institutions participating in this project include the Brazilian Ministry of Health the Ministry of Health and the Environment of the Republic of Argentina. **(A)**

3) Definition of a preliminary working agenda for joint activities between the Oswaldo Cruz Foundation - FIOCRUZ and the National Administration of Laboratories & Health Institutions – ANLIS. The objective of this enterprise, with Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 11,552.00, is to establish a preliminary agenda

for technical cooperation activities between FIOCRUZ and the National Administration of Laboratories & Health Institutions (ANLIS). Those involved on the Brazilian side, are the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), the Ministry of Health (MS)/FIOCRUZ and, on the Argentine side, the Ministry of Health & the Environment. **(A)**

4) Develop the Capacity of the National Administration of Laboratories & Health Institutions (ANLIS). This sub-project, the first phase of which was carried out in December 2006, aims to support the institutional development of government health research and technical development organisations in Argentina. Brazilian institutions involved in this project are the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Ministry of Health/Oswaldo Cruz Foundation (MS/FIOCRUZ) and, on the Argentine side, the National Administration of Laboratories & Health Institutions (ANLIS). Brazilian funding towards this project amounts to US\$ 56,568.00 (US\$ 30,568.00 from ABC and US\$ 26,000.00 from FIOCRUZ). **(P)**

5) Technical Support to Establish/implement a Human Milk Bank in the Argentine. As an additional initiative in the health care area, this project aims to establish a Human Milk Bank (BLH) of national importance in Argentina by through continued technology transfer and training of professionals to establish human milk banks throughout the country, seeking to establish bases, to form a network that will be able to strengthen the activities of health programs providing maternal and child health care. With Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 30,476.00, this project involves the Ministry of Health, on the Brazilian side, and ANLIS on the part of Argentina. **(U)**

ACTIVITIES / BOLIVIA

1) Exploratory Mission to establish new technical co-operation projects between Brazil and Bolivia. Jointly coordinated by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and by the National Service of Industrial Learning (SENAI) and carried out by the Ministry of Agrarian Development (MDA), on the Brazilian side, and the Instituto Nacional de Desarrollo y Reforma

Agraria (INRA) on the Bolivian side, this project will cover the daily expenses and travel costs for two Brazilian specialists to participate in a mission to Bolivia to establish, in conjunction with their Bolivian counterparts, new technical co-operation projects in the Pando and Beni Departments. Brazilian funding for this project will be in the amount of US\$ 3,960.00. **(A)**

2) Exploratory mission to establish new technical cooperation projects between Brazil and Bolivia.

The objective of this mission was to meet with Bolivian counterparts to establish new technical cooperation projects in the Pando and Beni Departments. Those participating in these activities, in addition to the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), were the Ministry of Agrarian Development (MDA), the Ministry of Labour and Employment (TEM), the Brazilian National Transport Infrastructure Department (DNIT), the National Rural Apprenticeship Training Service (SENAR), the National Institute for Colonial & Agrarian Reform (INCRA), and the Brazilian Agricultural and Livestock Research Corporation (EMBRAPA). Brazilian funding for this project amounted to US\$ 10,200.00. **(A)**

3) Exploratory Mission to Develop Technical Cooperation Projects between Brazil and Bolivia in the Areas of Environment, Agriculture, and Health.

The aim of this initiative was to move forward in the process to formulate projects that have been conceived in environmental, agricultural, and health areas, within the scope of the Special Mission for Brazil-Bolivia Cooperation. Coordinated by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), this project also received the support of the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Supply (MAPA), the Ministry of Health (MS), the Brazilian Agricultural and Livestock Research Corporation (EMBRAPA), the Agricultural Corporation of the State of Minas Gerais (EPAMIG), the Brazilian Institute for the Environment & Renewable Natural Resources (IBAMA), and the Gama Filho University (UGF). Brazilian funding for this project was in the amount of US\$ 10,655.14. **(A)**

4) Exploratory Mission to train Bolivian technicians on Biofuels from a Social-Environmental Perspective, at the Meeting of the South-American Community of Nations Meeting.

This project, with the support of Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 2,112.00, aims to train Bolivian technicians in biofuels and to identify possible Brazil-Bolivia technical cooperation in this sector. Those involved are the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), as Brazilian coordinator and executor of the project and the Ministry of Agriculture (MA), as the executor institution on behalf of Bolivia. **(A)**

5) To train technicians on the heart-of-palm crop (*Bactris gasipaes*) in Chapare – Final Phase.

The aim of this initiative is to

provide support, through the transfer of technology in agronomic management, phytosanitary management, processing and commercialization, so as to increase the crop area, in the region of Chapare, and to establish the crop of heart-of-palm, which is of considerable economic importance to the economy of the region, as well as to provide a legal, alternative form of crop for local settlers living in the area. The final phase of this project will receive Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 1,408.95, and will involve sending Brazilian technicians to visit the region and provide support in the above-mentioned areas. Brazilian institutions participating in this project are the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), as coordinator, the Executive Planning Commission for Cacao Crop (CEPLAC) / the Cacao Research Centre (CEPEC) and, on the Bolivian side, the Ministry of Farmers, Agriculture and Livestock (MACA) / Vice Ministry for Alternative Development. **(A)**

6) To provide training for the heart-of-palm crop (*Bactris gasipaes*) in Chapare – Implementation of the Pilot Plan.

In order to ensure continuity of the above-mentioned project, the implementation of the pilot plan is presently being carried out to provide agronomic management of heart-of-palm in the region of Chapare, as well as to train Bolivian technicians in Brazilian agronomic methods used in the heart-of-palm crop, and in matters related to the dynamics already established within the pilot plan. Brazilian investment in this project will amount to US\$ 3,536.00. **(A)**

7) To train and provide the transfer of technology to Support the Coffee Productive Circuit Competitiveness in the Yungas Region – Phase II.

This initiative seeks to improve the technical know-how of producers in the region of Yungas, in the technological management of coffee, as well as in the different phases of production, industrialization and commercialization. During the first phase, Brazilian technicians were sent to Bolivia to offer technical advice, and Bolivian technicians visited Brazil to be trained in specific areas of production (agricultural management, handling, drying, processing and commercialization of coffee). During the second phase, and, to conclude the project and as part of the programme, eight Bolivians will be trained in Brazil and a Pilot Plan will be established in the country. Those participating in this project include the Agricultural Research Corporation of the State

of Minas Gerais (EPAMIG), the Federal University of Viçosa (UFV), on behalf of Brazil, and the Ministry of Farmers, Agriculture and Livestock (MACA) / Vice-Ministry of Agriculture, Farming & Fisher for Bolivia. Brazilian funding in support of this project will amount to US\$ 25,000.00. **(P)**

8) Mission to provide Training for Bolivian Farming Experts in Coffee Production and Commercialization. Still in its negotiating phase, this initiative proposes to provide training courses for Bolivian agronomists in coffee production and commercialization management. Brazilian funding towards this project is calculated at US\$ 17,117.92. **(A)**

09) To Control the Boll Weevil in Cotton Plantations and to Identify Areas Declared Free of Pests. This subproject, which involves, on the Brazilian side, the Department of Defence & Inspection of Vegetable Matter at the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock & Supply (DDVI/MAPA) and, on the Bolivian side by the National Agricultural & Farming Sanitation & Food Hygiene Service of the Ministry of Farmers, Farming & Livestock Affairs (SENA-SAG/MACA), aims to train Bolivian technicians in the planning, management and use of phytosanitary measures for the prevention and control of the Cotton Boll Weevil, as well as the delimitation and maintenance of areas declared free of pests in Bolivia, along the frontier border regions with Brazil. Brazilian funding will be in the amount of US\$ 27,499.00. **(P)**

10) Training and Transfer of Technology for Crops and Processing of Tropical Fruits in the Chapare and Yungas areas. This project seeks to train technicians and transfer technology used in crops, phytosanitary management, processing and commercialization of tropical fruits in the Chapare and in Yungas areas of La Paz, with the aim of increasing the availability of these products in Bolivia. Those involved in this initiative on the Brazilian side, in addition to the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), are the State University of the Southeast of Bahia, and on behalf of Bolivia, the Ministério de Agricultura, Ganaderia y Desarrollo Rural (MAGDR)/Vice-Ministério de Desarrollo Alternativo (VIMDESALT). Brazilian funding will be around of US\$ 25,000.00. **(U)**

11) Support for the National Programme for the Eradication of Foot & Mouth Disease. This project, with Brazilian funding in the sum

of US\$ 50,000.00, will provide the transfer of technology to help establish strategies for the prevention and eradication of foot and mouth disease, within the programme initiated by Bolivia for the eradication of this disease. It is principally directed towards the Beni and Santa Cruz Divisions, in the border zone with Brazil, where the greatest number of foot and mouth cases have been registered within Bolivian territory. Those participating in this project on behalf of Brazil, are the Animal Defence Department of the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock & Supply (DDA/MAPA), and by the National Agricultural & Farming Sanitary & Food Safety Service (SENASAG) of the Ministry for Farmers, Farming & Livestock Affairs (MACA) on behalf of Bolivia. **(U)**

12) Support to Create an Agricultural & Farming Research Institution. This project, which will receive Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 59,620.00, aims to provide technical support to set up a government agricultural and farming research institution, which can respond to Bolivian farming requirements, as well as train Bolivian technicians in this area. Participants in this project on behalf of Brazil, are the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), as coordinating institute, and, as executor institutions, the Brazilian Agricultural & Livestock Research Corporation (EMBRAPA) and, on the Bolivian side, the Ministério de Desarrollo Rural, Agropecuario y Medio Ambiente (MDRyMA). **(P)**

13) Strengthening Family Based Agriculture in the Beni and Pando Divisions. The initiative in question aims to identify viable alternatives, that can contribute towards strengthening Family Based Agriculture in the Beni and Pando Divisions, as well as encourage the exchange of technology with respect to the elaboration and execution of a support programme to benefit family based agriculture. On the Brazilian side, the institutions involved are the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), and the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA) and, on the Bolivian side, the Ministério de Desarrollo Rural, Agropecuario y Medio Ambiente (MDRyMA). Brazilian funding for this project is in the amount of US\$ 124,160.00. **(U)**

14) Train Government Technicians & Managers & Provide Technical Exchange for the Development of Government Political Instruments for Family Based Agriculture/ Farmers & Agrarian Reform. Coordinated in conjunction with the Brazilian Cooperation

(P) projects / (A) activities / (U) undertakings

Agency (ABC), and by the Vice-Ministério de Inversión Pública y Financiamiento Externo, having as its executor, on behalf of Brazil, the Ministry of Agrarian Development (MDA) and the Brazilian Institute for Colonisation & Agrarian Reform (INCRA) and, on the Bolivian side, the Ministério de Desarrollo Rural, Agropecuario y Medio Ambiente (MDRAyMA) and the Instituto Nacional de Reforma Agraria (INRA), the subproject aims to provide support to formulate and implement government policies and strengthen Bolivian institutions responsible for areas involving family based agriculture, agrarian reform and the development of rural activities. Brazilian funding for this project is approximately of US\$ 47,356.66. **(P)**

15) Management of Wild Life. Based on examples already established in Brazil, where breeding wild animals in officially recognised animal farms, controlled and monitored by government officials has helped reduce the illegal sale and extinction of certain species, Bolivia seeks to adopt suitable measures to preserve its local wildlife and, at the same time, to provide an economic alternative to create jobs and with great potential for exports based on standards to ensure sustainable biodiversity. This project aims to provide the transfer of know-how on sustainable management of wildlife, especially along the border regions of the country, as well as to train technicians in methods to control and monitor the local fauna. Brazilian institutions participating in this project, are the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), and the Brazilian Institute of the Environment & Renewable Natural Resources (IBAMA) and, on the Bolivian side, the Ministério de Desenvolvimento Sustentável e Planejamento/Vice-Ministério de Meio Ambiente e Recursos Naturais and the General Management for Biodiversity. Brazilian funding towards the project will amount to US\$ 70,000.00. **(U)**

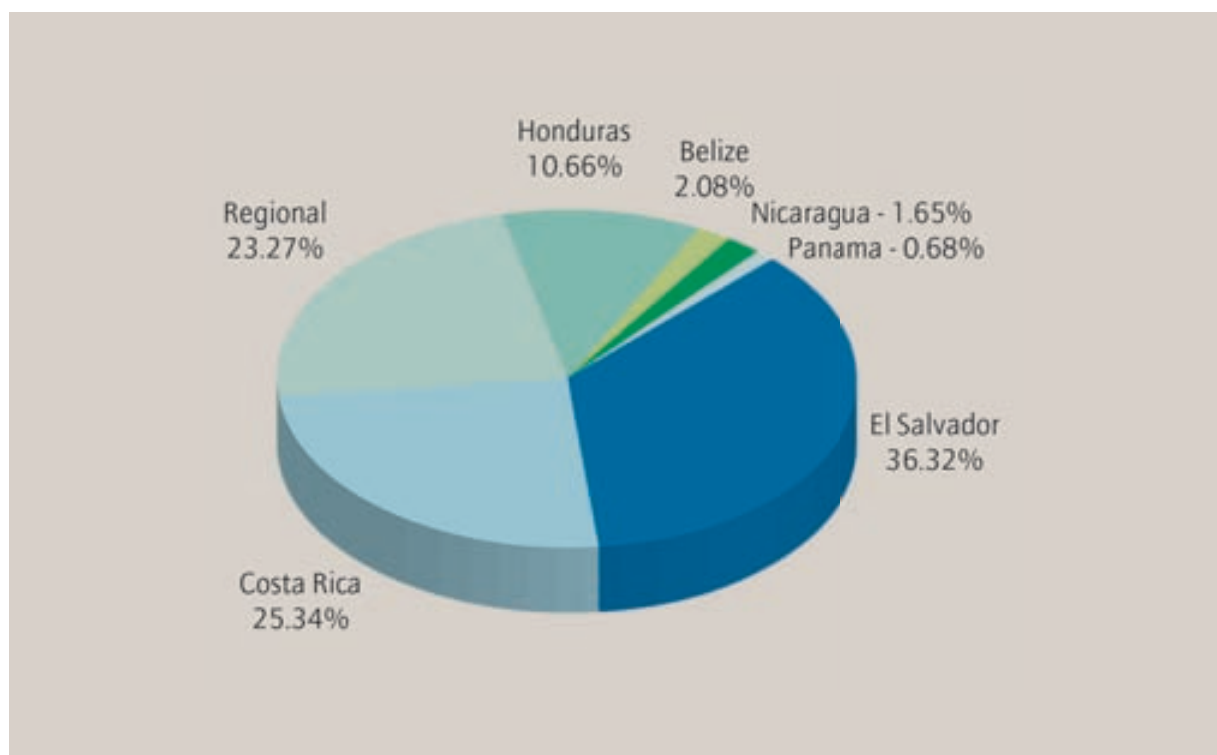

COOPERATION ACTIVITIES IN CENTRAL AMERICA BY COUNTRY (%)



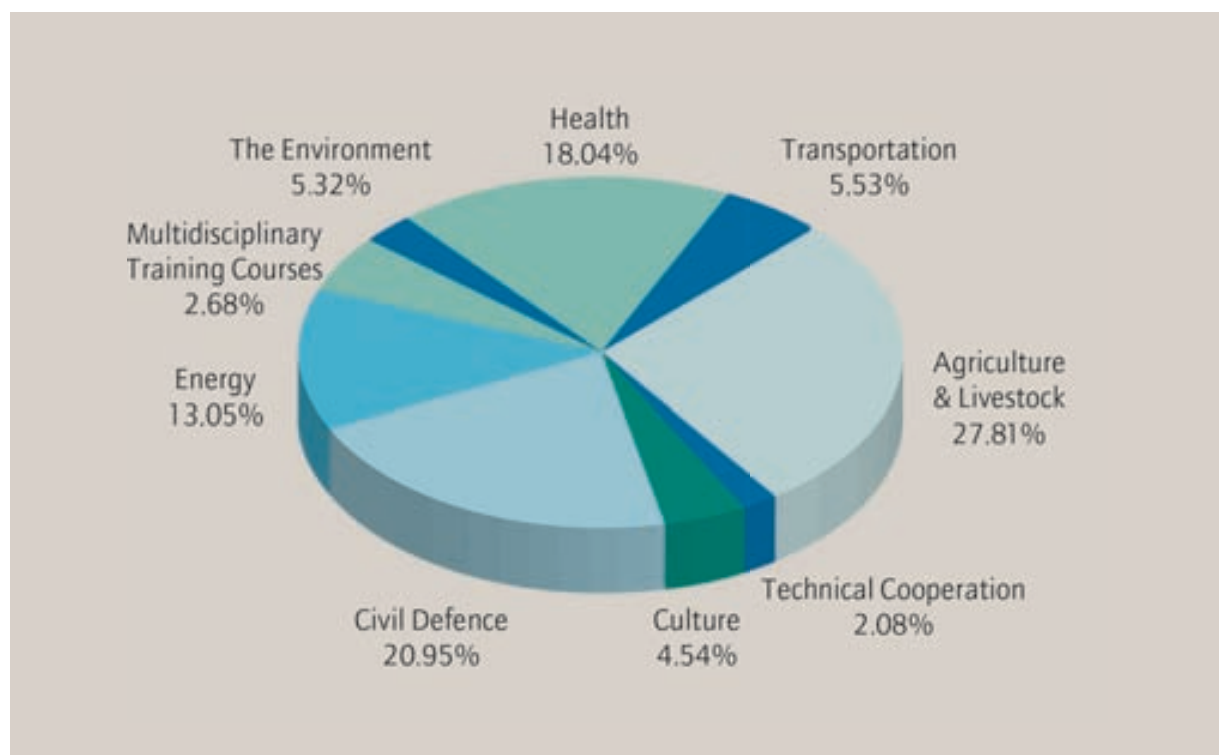

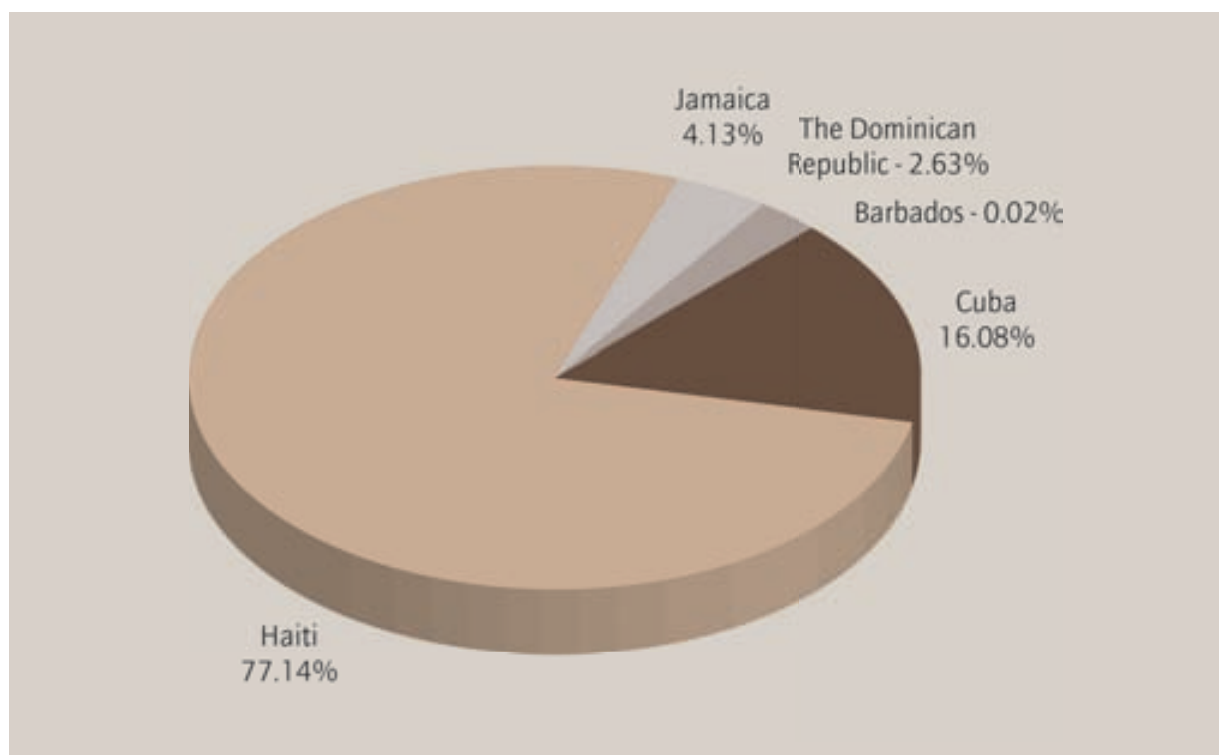

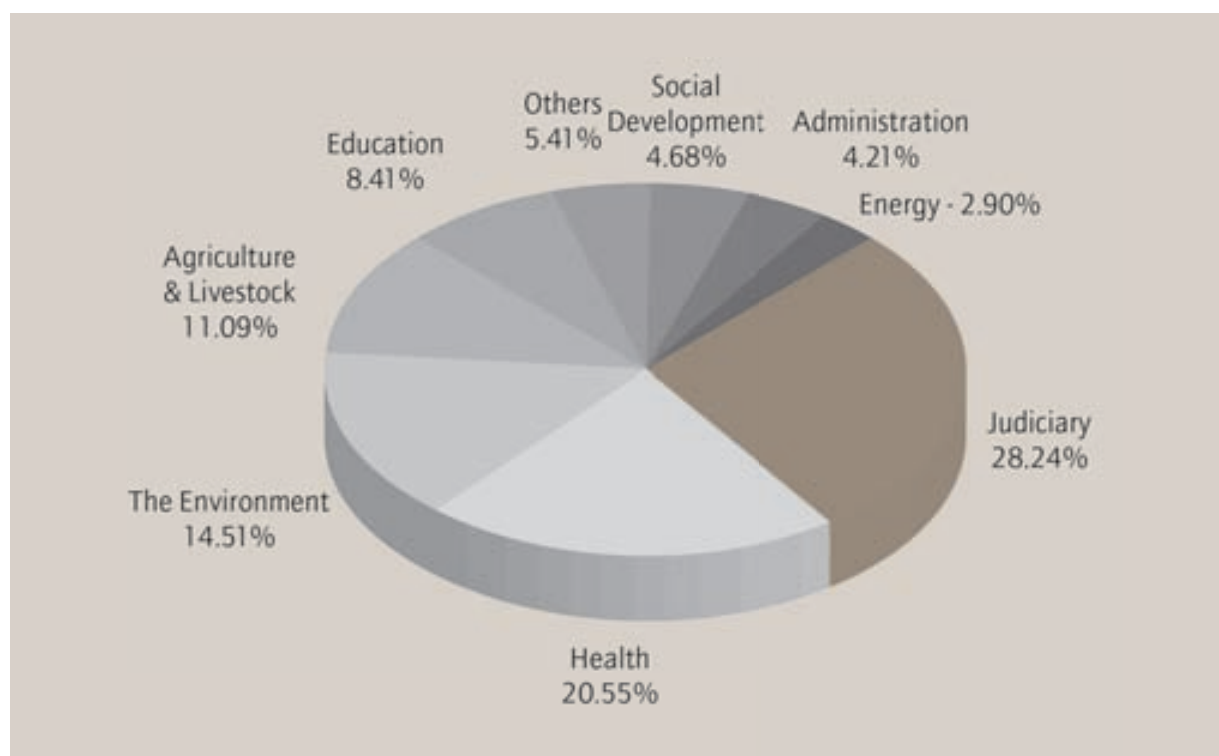

05) Project to Strengthen Dentistry Practices in Brazil and Cuba – Phase I. This initiative, coordinated in conjunction with the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Ministério para la Inversión Extranjera y la Colaboración Económica (MINVEC) of Cuba, will be carried out jointly by the Brazilian and Cuban Ministries of Health, aims to strengthen dentistry practices in both countries by means of the transfer of expertise of Cuban practices in stomatology and Brazilian techniques in the manufacture of dental prosthetics. 06) Mission to Explore and Train Haitian Technicians at the Meeting of the South-American Community Nations on Biofuels under a Socio-Environmental Perspective.

This mission, developed jointly by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Ministry of Agriculture, Natural Resources and Rural Development of Haiti, aims to train Haitian technicians on biofuels and to identify Brazil-Haiti technical cooperation possibilities in this sector. With Brazilian funding of US\$ 3,076.95, this project involved the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the University of São Carlos (USC) for Brazil, and the office of the Prime Minister of Jamaica. **(A)**

07) Provide Technical Support to the Government of Jamaica in the Area of Ethanol fuel and its inclusion in the Country's Matrix Energy System. Still within the area of biofuels, the aim of this project was to identify and detail possible areas of cooperation between Brazil and Jamaica in matters related to ethanol, and prospects involved in the debate about the Plan to introduce ethanol in the

country's matrix energy system, whether from an agricultural, industrial or financial-economic point of view. Institutions involved in this project were the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Institute of Technological Research (IPT) on behalf of Brazil, and the office of the Prime Minister of Jamaica. Brazilian funding for this project was in the amount of US\$ 2,979.87. **(A)**

08) Project to Train Personnel and Transfer of Expertise to support the Jamaican Modernization Programme of the Sugar-Alcohol Industry. 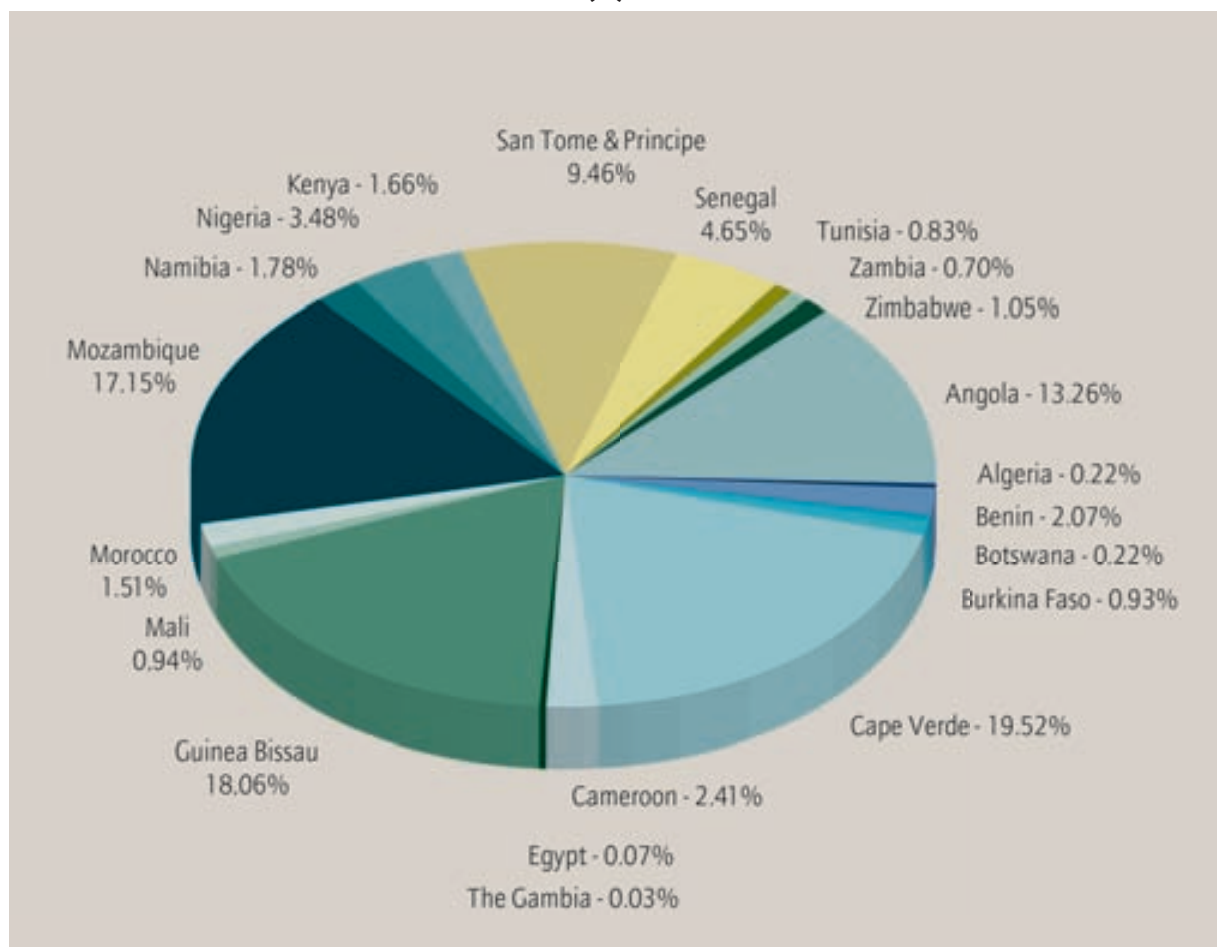

COOPERATION ACTIVITIES IN AFRICA BY COUNTRY (%)



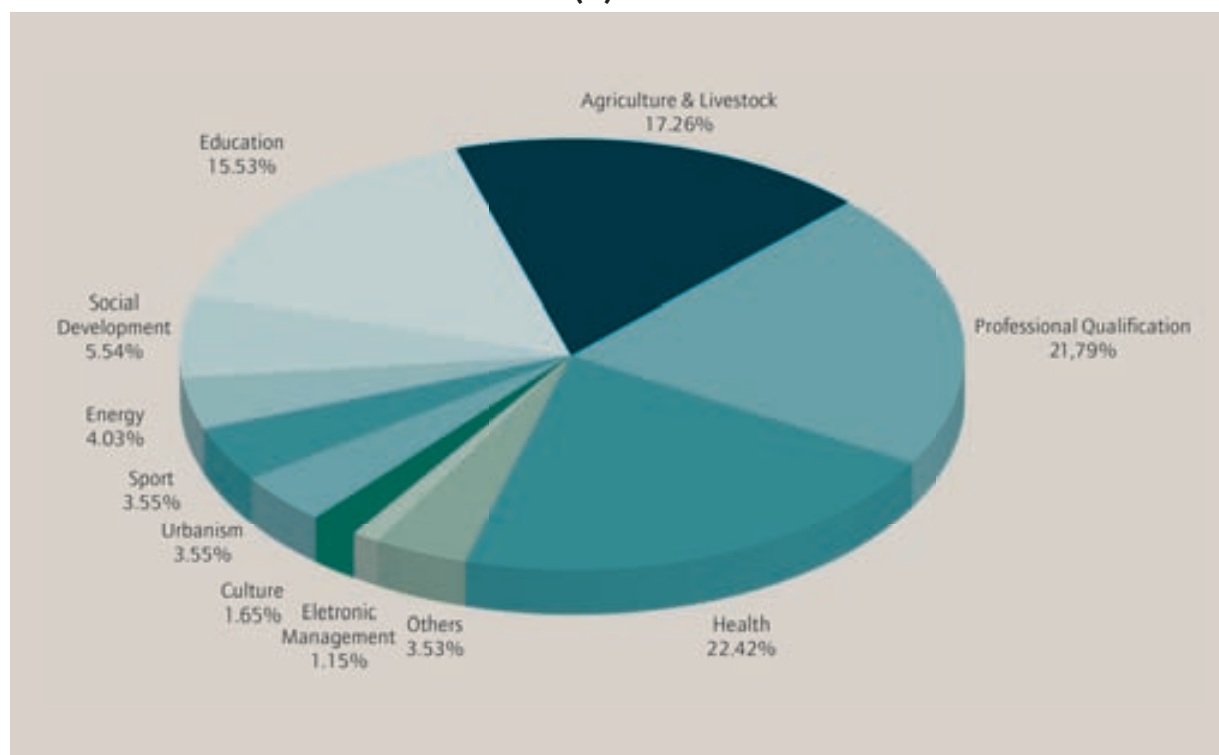

SOUTH-SOUTH COOPERATION PROJECTS CARRIED OUT BY BRAZIL

ACTIVITIES / ANGOLA

01) Institutional Strengthening of Agronomic and Veterinary Research Institutions.

In addition to the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), this project involves the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA), as executor of the project. For Angola, the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development acts as coordinator. The project aims to widen the management capacity and adaptation of technologies to be used to develop tropical fruit production, olericulture, the growth of different types of feed plants, sweet potato, and to expand the capacity to produce grains in Angola, as well as to introduce new technologies in different areas involving the small agricultural producers of that country. In the area of livestock, the project aims to improve the management capacity and the adaptation of new technologies aimed at developing cattle and goat breeding in Angola, to benefit small producers. Brazilian funding for this project is in the amount of US\$ 46,620.00. **(P)**

02) To Reorganize, provide Institutional Strengthening, and Methodological Innovation of Rural Extension as a Strategy for Sustainable Rural Development in Angola.

This initiative involves, on behalf of Brazil, the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), the Technical Assistance & Rural Extension Company (EMATER) and the University of Viçosa (UFV), and aims to promote courses in models of production for technicians from Angolan governmental bodies that support the agriculture and livestock sector of the country. The project also aims to train technicians from Angolan governmental bodies in rural extension methodologies and seeks to implement, monitor and provide an assessment of rural extension models suitable for the realities of the country. Brazilian funding for this project is in the amount of US\$ 58,448.00. **(P)**

03) Schools for All. This project seeks to support the Angolan education system by increasing the availability of specialised methods of teaching, by forming teachers and, thereby, strengthening the process

of inclusion for students with special educational needs. Institutions involved in this project are the Ministry of Education, for Brazil, and the National Institute for Special Education at the Ministry of Education (INEE) representing Angola. Brazilian investment for this undertaking will be in the amount of US\$ 130,250.00. **(U)**

04) To Identify Angolan Needs in Areas of Cultural Administration, the Recovery of Audiovisual Material and Historical Archives.

The objective of this project is to support the Angolan National Cultural Heritage Institute, museums in Angola and the Historical Archives of Angola in the administration and development of cultural heritage sectors (material and imaterial culture, museological and documental areas). Institutions involved in this project on behalf of Brazil are the Ministry of Culture through the Institute of National Historical and Artistic Heritage (MinC/IPHAN) and, on the Angolan side, by the Ministry of Culture of Angola. Brazilian funding for this project is in the order of US\$ 23,480.00. **(A)**

05) Cultural Heritage Training: Cultural Heritage Inventories, the Conservation of Documents, the Structuring of Museums.

With Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 280,000.00, this project aims to support the Angolan National Cultural Heritage Institute, museums in Angola and the Historical Archives of Angola, in the management and development of cultural heritage sectors (involving material and imaterial culture, museological and documental areas). Institutions involved in this undertaking are the Ministry of Culture-Institute of National Historical and Artistic Heritage (MinC/IPHAN) for Brazil, and the Ministry of Culture (MinC/Angola) representing Angola. **(U)**

06) Support to Preserve Records and the Audiovisual Material of Angola.

Another initiative in the cultural area, this project aims to train Angolan technicians in methods to preserve records and audiovisual material. With funding from Brazil estimated at US\$

175,000.00, this initiative is coordinated by the Ministry of Culture/Technical Audiovisual Centre (Minc/CTAv), for Brazil, and by the Ministry of Culture of Angola. (MinC-Angola). **(U)**

07) To transfer the Control of the Cazenga Instruction Centre. This professional training project, which was initiated in 2005, is coordinated by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), and has as its Brazilian executor, the National Service of Industrial Learning (SENAI), of São Paulo, with Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 72,563.00. Angolan partners are the Ministry of Public Administration, Employment and Social Security and the National Institute for Employment and Professional Training. In its present phase, the purpose of this initiative is to assist in the process to transfer the control of the Cazenga Instruction Centre to Angolan authorities and to set up new training courses. Courses teaching car mechanics and metal work have already been established. **(A)**

08) To Identify the Angolan Needs in Areas of Malaria, Family Health, Nutrition, Health Care and Human Milk Banks. This project, coordinated by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), was carried out by the Ministries of Health of both countries and sought to collect information to be used to develop technical cooperation projects between Brazil and Angola in areas of malaria, family health, nutrition, health care and human milk banks. Brazilian funding for this initiative came to a total of US\$12,160.00. **(A)**

09) Support to restructure the network of health care libraries in Angola and Mozambique. Coordinated by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and by the Brazilian Ministry of Health, through the Oswaldo Cruz Foundation (FIOCRUZ), and by their Angolan counterparts, the aim of this project is to support the strengthening of the Health System in Angola in areas related to teaching and science and technology, as well as in communications and information. The purpose of this initiative is to restructure the network of

health care libraries in Angola (as well as in Mozambique). Brazilian funding was in the amount of US\$ 9,558.00. **(A)**

10) To Strengthen the Health System in the Republic of Angola (FIOCRUZ).

To strengthen the Angolan health system, especially in the fields of teaching and science and technology, as well as in communications and information, is the objective of this project, which will be supervised by the Ministries of Health of both countries and coordinated by the Oswaldo Cruz Foundation (FIOCRUZ), and involves Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 357,410.00. **(U)**

11) Provide Support to the Programme to Prevent and Control Malaria.

As with the project mentioned above, this initiative seeks to strengthen the local health system, and has as its coordinating agent the Health Care Secretariat at the Ministry of Health (SVS/ MS). The main objective of this project is to provide support to the Programme for the Prevention and Control of Malaria, so as to reduce the number of cases of this disease in Angola. Costs involved in this initiative for Brazil will come to US\$ 155,000.00.

12) Project to Promote Social Involvement through the Practice of Sports.

Brazilian funding for this project, which involves the Brazilian Ministry of Sports and the Angolan Ministry of Youth and Sport, is estimated at US\$ 106,218.00. The objective of this project is to support the Angolan Ministry in its efforts to implement a National Policy of Sports and plans to include the implementation of a complementary educational programme by means of the practice of sports, to benefit 1000 children in deprived areas. The project will also enable individuals held in prison to participate in the country's production process, by manufacturing sporting material. In this respect, a factory producing footballs was installed in Luanda in 2006, and training given to 400 prisoners in the manufacturing of sporting goods. **(U)**

13) To Strengthen Environmental Education in Angola.

This initiative,

with Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 79,300.00, involves, on the Brazilian side, the Ministry for Environment and, on the part of Angola, the Ministry of Urbanisation and Environment, with the main objectives of training educational (multiplying) agents in matters involving Environmental Education, as well as to help prepare a National Environmental Education Programme in Angola. **(P)**

14) To Identify Angolan Needs in Areas of Census, Research, Information

and Strategic Planning Technology Systems. Led by the Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics (IBGE) and by the National Institute of Statistics of Angola (INEA), this project collected information to be used to develop technical cooperation projects between Brazil and Angola in the areas of census, research, information and strategic planning technology systems. The project, which was developed between October and November 2006, was carried out with the support of a Brazilian contribution of US\$ 10,260.00. **(A)**

ACTIVITIES / ALGERIA

01) Technical Cooperation Mission to Present Proposals in the Area of Agriculture. This project, coordinated by the Federal University of Viçosa (UFV), aims to train Algerian technicians in techniques to preserve soil and water resources, by making use of computer software to prepare a cartographic chart and to organize thematic data (use of soil, vegetation coverage, water and a transport system network), as well as to instruct them in pasture management techniques, soil recovery, goat breeding management, the conservation of the ecosystem (agrosilvicultura) and how to prepare a socio-economic diagnosis. Brazilian

costs towards this project will be in the amount of US\$ 21,100.00. **(A)**

02) Technical Cooperation Mission to Present Proposals in the Area of the Treatment Burn. Involving Brazilian funding to the present date of US\$3,680.00, this mission aims to present and discuss with Algerian authorities, a proposal for a technical cooperation project, in the area of the burn treatment, which will be implemented by the Brazilian Ministry of Health, through the Brazilian Burn Society, and to arrange for the signature of a supplementary agreement. **(A)**

ACTIVITIES / BENIN

01) Mission to Detail Technical Cooperation Projects in the Areas of Health, Education, Social Development and Agriculture. With the participation of the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Ministries of Agriculture, Health, the Ministry of Social Development, and the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA), representing Brazil, as well as the Benin Ministry of Foreign Business, the main objectives of this project are to present a concrete proposal for technical cooperation in the diagnosis and treatment of malaria in Benin; to demonstrate Brazilian expertise and experience in the Family Grant Programme (Programa Bolsa-Familia);

to suggest technical cooperation projects in the area of cotton growing and to make available to the Benin Ministry of Agriculture, the necessary technical elements to respond to the demands of local producers interested in the planting and processing of sugarcane, with the view to producing biofuels. Brazilian funding for this project was in the amount of US\$ 25,040.00. **(A)**

02) To Train Experts in the Different Stages of the Production Process of Ethanol made from Sugar-cane. The activity in question aims to train eight experts from Benin in the different stages involved

in the production of ethanol using sugarcane. This course, which includes a section on agronomics, will be offered by the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA), in Maceio, State of Alagoas, while several private companies will also provide training in other areas of the production process. Brazilian funding for this project is estimated in the amount of US\$ 85,000.00. **(U)**

03) To Identify Needs in the Area of Cotton Growing. This initiative, which will involve the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA), on behalf of Brazil, and the Ministry of Agriculture of Benin, seeks to collect information to be used to develop technical cooperation activities between Brazil and Benin in the area of cotton growing, with Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 5,840.00. **(A)**

04) To Strengthen Cotton Growing in Benin. This project, which should be signed after the ratification of the Basic Technical

Cooperation Agreement between Brazil and Benin, aims to train technicians from Benin, in areas involving the documentation and conservation of germ plasma, the biological control of *Helicoverpa armigera*, processing of cotton fibre and processing of cotton seeds, to be carried out by the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA). Brazilian investment for this project is estimated at US\$ 100,500.00. **(A)**

05) Project to Train Doctors and Biochemical Pharmacists in the Treatment and Parasitological Diagnosis with Quality Control. This training is aimed at two biochemical pharmacists from Benin who will receive training in parasitological diagnosis of malaria, to take place at the Evandro Chagas Institute in Manaus. The courses will last 15 and 21 days, respectively. When they return to Benin, these professionals will be able to serve as multiplying agents of the knowledge acquired in their respective professions. Costs to Brazil are estimated at US\$ 20,000.00. **(U)**

ACTIVITIES / BOTSWANA

01) To Provide Training in the Area of the Production and Distribution of Anti-Retroviral Treatment. This activity was carried out during the period of May 20-30, 2007, at a cost of US\$ 25,000.00 to Brazil. Five health professionals from Botswana visited Brasilia, Recife, and Rio de Janeiro to learn about

Brazilian expertise and experience in HIV-AIDS treatment. As part of this mission, the aforementioned technicians visited the National Programme for Sexually Transmitted Diseases-AIDS and visited factories producing medicines, as well as quality control laboratories, schools, and hospitals. **(A)**

ACTIVITIES / BURKINA FASO

01) To Identify the needs of Burkina Faso in the area of Cotton Growing. With the participation of the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA), on behalf

of Brazil, and the Ministry of Agriculture of Burkina Faso, this initiative aims to identify the needs of that country in the area of cotton growing. Brazilian funding for the project will be in the amount of US\$ 105,980.00. **(A)**

ACTIVITIES / CAPE VERDE

01) To support the technical mission to prepare technical cooperation projects in the area of Rural Engineering, Agriculture

and Livestock. This activity, which has the support of the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), the Brazilian Agricultural

Research Corporation (EMBRAPA), and the National Institute of Research and Agrarian Development (INIDA) of Cape Verde, aims to collect information, undertake technical visits to research institutions and to areas of production and to identify, jointly with official Cape Verde farming experts, possible areas for bilateral technical cooperation, with the view to formulate projects. Brazilian funding for this initiative is in the amount of US\$ 8,358.59. **(A)**

02) To Provide Support for the Development of Horticulture. To consolidate a policy to expand horticulture in Cape Verde, so as to help the rural development of the country, to create new jobs and income for the country, by providing training for specialists from the National Institute of Investigation and Agrarian Development (INIDA), as the Cape Verde partner in this initiative, in vegetable and tropical fruit production systems and the transfer of germ plasma of olericulture plants and fruits from the public domain to Cape Verde are the main objectives of this project. Those involved in this project on behalf of Brazil, are the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA), jointly responsible for costs in the amount of US\$ 1 67,000.00. **(U)**

03) To Provide Support to Develop Sheep and Goat Production. With the participation of the same entities as mentioned in the previous project (ABC, EMBRAPA and INIDA), this initiative seeks to consolidate a policy to expand farming in Cape Verde, in areas of rural development, the creation of new jobs and income for the country, by providing training for specialists from the National Institute of Investigation and Agrarian Development (INIDA), in animal production systems, with emphasis on the breeding of sheep and goats and in the transfer of genetic material of animal origin from the public domain to Cape Verde. Brazilian funding for this project will be in the amount of US\$ 155,000.00. **(U)**

04) To Provide Support for the Institutional Strengthening of INIDA. At a cost of US\$ 65,000.00 on the part of Brazil and with the support of the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation

(EMBRAPA), this initiative proposes to consolidate an expansion policy of Cape Verde farming activities, with the aim of supporting rural development and the creation of new jobs and income for the country, by strengthening the National Institute of Investigation and Agrarian Development (INIDA). **(U)**

05) Solidarity Alphabetisation Programme in Cape Verde – Phase II. 08) To Provide Support to Establish the University of Cape Verde and to Develop Higher Education.

Coordinated by the Brazilian Ministry of Education, through the Secretariat of Higher Education (SESU), and by the Cape Verde Ministry of Education and Higher Studies, and the National Commission to Establish the University of Cape Verde (UNI / CV), this project seeks to support the implementation of the University of Cape Verde (UNI / CV), and to structure a of higher education subsystem. Costs on the part of Brazil came to US\$ 175,000.00. **(P)**

09) To Strengthen and Provide Technical Training for Personnel for the Cape Verde Professional Formation System.

With Brazilian funding estimated at US\$ 797,212.00, this subproject has been developed by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), by the National Service for Industrial Learning (SENAI), on the part of Brazil, and by the Institute of Employment and Professional Formation of Cabo Verde and aims to train professionals from the Cape Verde institution referred to above, as well as professionals from partner entities, and to create conditions for the implementation of a future Centre of Excellence in the area of Professional Formation, by transferring knowledge, methodologies and expertise from Brazilian institutions in the field. **(U)**

10) Revision "C": To Strengthen and Provide Technical Training for Personnel for the Professional Formation System of Cape Verde.

With a budget of US\$ 150,000.00 on the part of Brazil, this project involves the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the National Service for Industrial Learning (SENAI), and has as its counterpart the Institute of Employment and Professional Formation of Cape Verde, the objective of this project is to train professionals at the afore-mentioned Institute and other professionals from partner entities, as well as create conditions for the implementation of a future Centre of Excellence in the area of Professional Formation, by transferring knowledge, methodologies and expertise from Brazilian institutions in the field. **(U)**

This initiative aims to strengthen the country's Epidemiological Health Surveillance service, so as to control the number of cases of this disease and to locate areas where malaria occurs in the country, mainly by improving the quality of the diagnosis of malaria and

The project aims to construct family water cisterns, underground storage dams, crop systems using techniques to collect rainwater in situ, in available agriculture areas suitable for this purpose, in rural communities located in the Provinces of Gaza, Inhambane and Tete, with the objective of improving their food-nutritional security and guaranteeing that Mozambicans living in more deprived areas have access to drinking water suitable for human consumption, and the production of basic foods. This project, which is coordinated by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and by the Ministry of Health (STD/AIDS Programme), on behalf of Brazil, and by the Ministry of Health (MS) of Mozambique, aims to allow the exchange of expertise between those taking part in the Brazilian Health in Schools programme and the Mozambican Generation Biz. To this end, a team of 20 Brazilian technicians was sent to Maputo. As a result, working plans were developed to help overcome the frailties of the Programmes in both countries. 11) "We are Together" – Social Policies, Promoting Sexual and Reproductive Health and the Prevention of Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD) and AIDS – Model II. Carried out in October 2006, Model II of this Project involved the same players as the first phase. The Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) contributed with the cost of airline tickets for the Brazilian technicians to travel to Belo Horizonte, to take part in a Workshop directed towards the exchange of expertise between Brazilians and Mozambicans who had participated in Unit I and used the knowledge gained during the first phase in the schools where they work. The cost of this phase to Brazil was in the amount of US\$ 25,000.00. **(A)**

12) To Provide Support to the Programme for the Control and Prevention of Malaria. In 2006, and before the project was initiated, a mission of malaria specialists was sent to Mozambique to identify the real needs of the country, towards which Brazil proposes to allocate the sum of US\$ 150,000.00. Institutions involved in this initiative on behalf of Brazil, are the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Ministry of Health (MS) and, on behalf of Mozambique, the Ministry of Health (MS-Mozambique). **(U)**

13) Evaluation of the prevention and control methods used to combat malaria in Mozambique. At the initiative of the coordinators of the project, namely the

Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC)/ Ministry of Health (MS), a team of malaria specialists was sent to Mozambique to identify the real needs of the Mozambicans before the project was initiated. This resulted in costs in the amount of US\$ 10,800.00. **(A)**

14) Technical and Economic Viability Study for the Installation of a Medication Manufacturing Plant in Mozambique to Produce Anti-Retroviral medication, amongst others. This project, which has been budgeted in the amount of US\$ 455,400.00, on the part of Brazil, seeks to verify the viability of establishing a manufacturing plant to produce anti-retrovirus and other viral medications in Mozambique, thereby complying with the preliminary understandings contained in the Agreement established between the governments of Brazil and Mozambique, as well as to propose complementary studies and alternative options, if necessary. Those involved in this undertaking on behalf of Brazil, are the Ministry of Health (MS) and the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and, on behalf of Mozambique, the Ministry of Health of that country. **(P)**

15) To Develop a Geo-environmental Map of the Metropolitan Region of Maputo. The objective of this project is to develop a geo-environmental map of the region of Maputo and to train Mozambican technicians in the use of software responsible for the compilation of data used to develop maps. Institutions involved in this project are the Geological Service of Brazil/Corporation for Mineral Resources Research (CPRM), and the National Geology and Mining Administration of Mozambique (DNGM). Costs came to US\$ 7,800.00. **(A)**

16) Construction of Popular Housing. This initiative aims to help reduce the lack of popular housing in Mozambique, by providing support to prepare a housing policy for low-income members of the country's population, by training Mozambique professionals in unconventional construction techniques, with the re-use of solid waste taken from civil construction projects, as well as to assist in establishing procedures to accompany civil engineering costs and indexes. Institutions involved in this project, in addition to the

With the participation of the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the National Institute of Metrology, Standardisation and Industrial Quality (INMETRO), on behalf of Brazil, and the National Institute of Standardisation and Quality (INNOQ) of Mozambique, and with Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 8,400.00, the objective of this project was to train members of the INNOQ in matters related to Technical Barriers to Commerce and the ISO/IEC 17025 Standards (which deal with the general conditions required to carry out tests/standardisations).

Interlinked with the above project, this initiative covered the traveling costs to bring three Namibian technicians to Brazil in December 2006, so that they could study unconventional construction methods as well as a pilot plan about solid waste management and a formula for basic sanitation. Costs to Brazil came to US\$ 14,400.00, involving the same institutions as mentioned above. **(A)**

With Brazilian funding estimated at US\$ 120,000.00, the project involves the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), the Ministry of Health (through the Farmanguinhos Foundation and the Instituto Oswaldo Cruz), as well as the Ministry of Health of Nigeria. **(U)**

05) Support for the Prevention and Control of Malaria Programme. This initiative proposes to increase the Prevention and Control of Malaria Programme in Nigeria by training technicians to operate an epidemiological care system, as well as to help in the implementation of this system; to train technicians in the precise examination

01) Malaria Project. The project aims to train Kenyan health workers in the prevention and control of malaria by strengthening the Epidemiological Care System, by improving the quality of diagnosis and in anti-malaria treatment, as well as by training technicians in the integrated control of malaria carriers. Costs involved are estimated at US\$ 105,000.00, and the implementation of the project now depends on the signing of the respective Complementary Agreements, which are presently being analysed by the Government of Kenya. **(U)**

02) To provide training to Fight Forest Fires. The objective of this project was to train senior officials from the Kenya Wildlife Service, with training offered by officers of the Fire Brigade of Rio de Janeiro, in techniques to fight forest fires, including the use of air support; inter-departmental integrated management techniques to provide a quick response in the event of natural disasters, as well as search and rescue procedures. This mission will include members of the Military Fire Brigade of Rio de Janeiro and involves costs estimated at US\$ 20,000.00. **(U)**

07) To Train Kenya Football Technicians. The present initiative seeks to transfer football training methods to Kenya professionals, so that they use this knowledge in their own country. Training was carried out by professionals from the Fluminense Football Club, in the Club's central training grounds, during a period of two weeks and involved, in addition to that Brazilian confederation, the Ministry of Supply, Sport, Culture and Social Services of Kenya. Costs to Brazil were in the amount of US\$ 20,207.27. **(A)**

This initiative, to which Brazil will contribute the amount of US\$ 51,984.00, aims to train technicians from San Tome governmental bodies providing support to farming and cattle breeding areas, in areas of institutional development, to make available original models and the transfer of technology; to facilitate the social organization and productive structure for family agriculture; and create a plan for sustainable rural development. Those participating in the project were the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC), the Technical Assistance and Rural Extension Company of Minas Gerais, the Federal University of Viçosa and the Ministry of Agriculture, Rural Development and Fishing of San Tome & Principe. **(P)**

02) Provide Support for the Development of Agricultural Land in the Democratic Republic of San Tome & Principe.

This project brings together the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) and the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA) on behalf of Brazil, and for San Tome, the Ministry of Agriculture, Rural Development and Fishing and the Centre of Agronomic and Technological Research (CIAT). 09) Preliminary Survey of the structure of hardware, software, and communication, with the aim of implementing electronic Management in San Tome & Principe.

This initiative, with Brazilian funding estimated at US\$ 21,970.00, aims to analyse the situation regarding the Information & Communications Technology situation in operation in the country, cooperating in particular in areas involving hardware, software and the communication framework; evaluating systems that are in use or are being studied and the relationship of these with the needs of the recipient country as well as the present state of Information & Communications Technology (ICT) in the world environment; with the view to implementing electronic management and digital inclusions to benefit the citizens of the country, considering decisive, educational and professionalizing

Brazilian investment in this project was in the amount of US\$ 21,034.28. **(A)**

04) Training for Pilots to Combat Locusts in Senegal. This initiative proposes, at a cost of US\$ 6,238.04 to Brazil, to effect the final training of personnel to form a team to combat locusts in Senegal. Taking part in this project, for Brazil, are the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock & Supply/Federal Office of Agriculture in the State of São Paulo (MAPA /DFASP) and, on behalf of Senegal, the Senegalese Institute of Agricultural Research (ISRA).

05) Training of Senegalese Technicians to Combat Mango Fruit Flies in Senegal.

At a cost of US\$ 4,745.10 on the part of Brazil, the objective of this project is to train Senegalese technicians to combat mango fruit flies. 09) To Form Personnel and Transfer Technology in Support of the National Programme Biofuels. The objective of this project is to formulate, organize, and consolidate a policy to create a reliable energy agriculture and a biofuel programme in Senegal, aimed at rural development, the creation of new jobs and income in the country, as well as substituting the use of

oil diesel with a consequent improvement in the quality of life for the population. 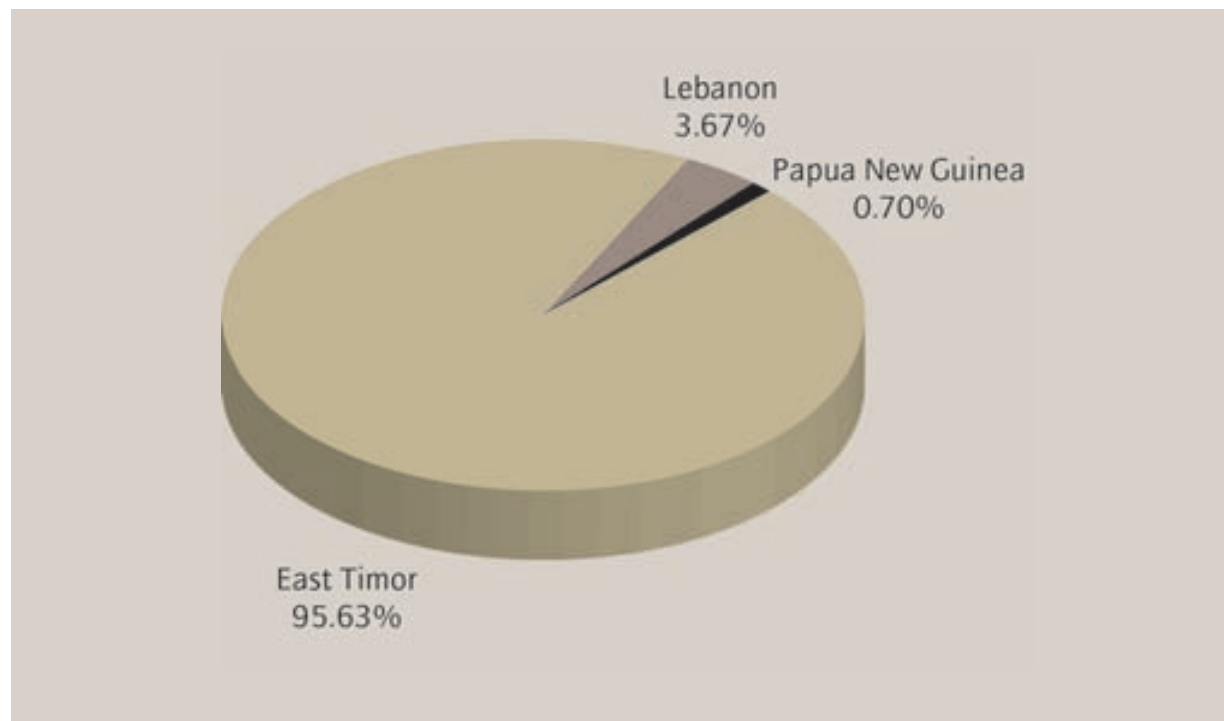

COOPERATION ACTIVITIES IN THE MIDDLE EAST / ASIA / OCEANIA BY COUNTRY (%)

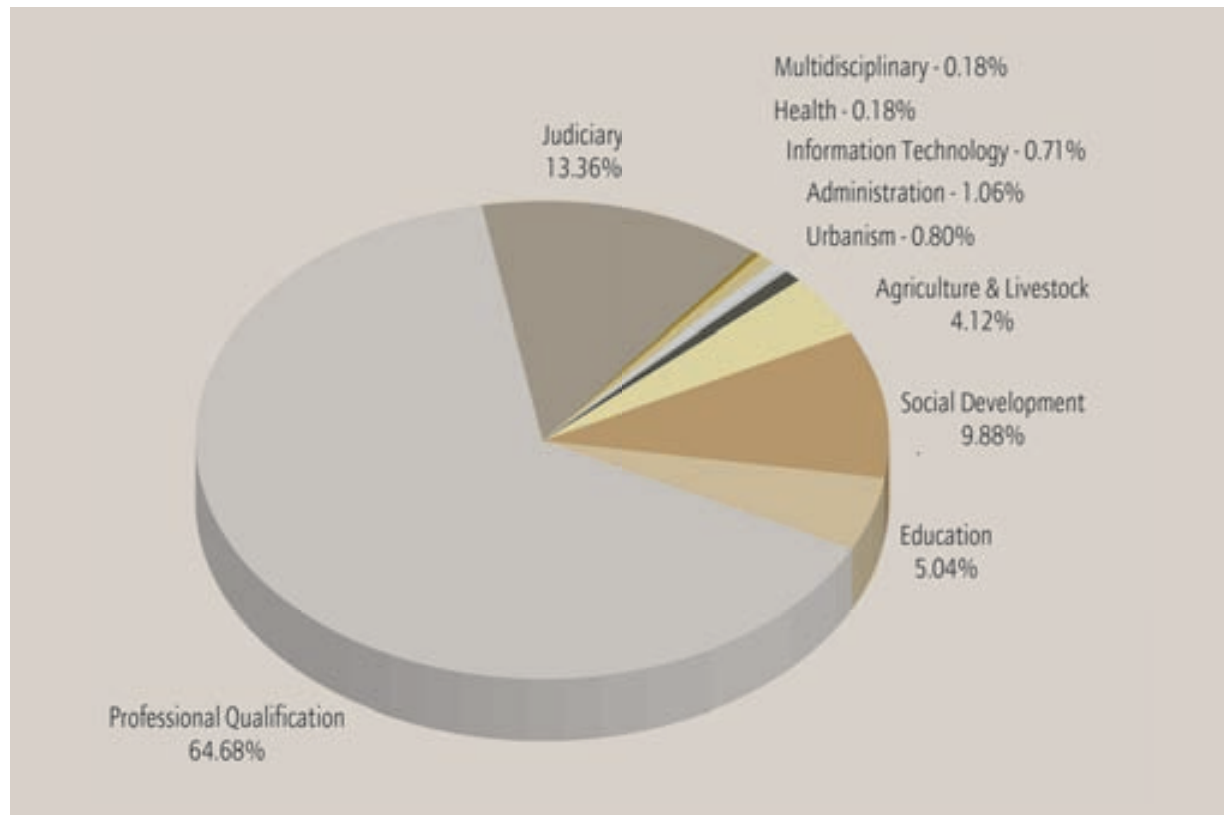

ACTIVITIES / LEBANON

01) Exploratory Mission to Identify Possibilities for Technical Cooperation Projects in the Area of Agriculture.

This project aims to identify possibilities for technical cooperation projects which can contribute towards the reconstruction of Lebanese agriculture. Those participating in the project on behalf of Brazil are the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA) and, on behalf of Lebanon, the Ministry of Agriculture. Brazilian investment was in the amount of US\$ 4,236.30. **(A)**

02) To Train Lebanese Technicians in agricultural and livestock activities.

Working within the framework of the above project, a team of 3 Brazilian researchers transferred techniques in matters relating to the breeding of dairy cattle, irrigation, and horticulture to Lebanese technicians from the Ministry of Agriculture of Lebanon. At a cost to Brazil of US\$ 12,592.53, this project was organized by the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA). **(A)**

03) Exploratory Mission to Identify Possibilities for Technical Cooperation in the Health Area in Lebanon. Involving the Ministries of Health in both countries, and with Brazilian funding in the amount of US\$ 4,049.69, this initiative sought to identify technical cooperation possibilities in the health area in Lebanon. **(A)**

With the participation on the part of Brazil, of the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation (EMBRAPA) and, on behalf of East Timor, of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forests and Fishing (MAFP), this project proposes to promote the sustainable development of agricultural and livestock sectors in East Timor, providing the necessary conditions required by the coffee producing sector, so as to increase volume, quality and competitiveness of production, thereby improving the income of the producer while maintaining the rural population in the area, with better social conditions and the conquest of foreign markets. Costs to Brazil came to US\$ 56,425.00. **(P)**

03) Support to Strengthen Agro-technical Schools in East Timor.

With costs to Brazil estimated at US\$ 114,025.00, and involving the Ministry of Education of Brazil (MEC) and the Ministry of Agriculture, Forests and Fishing (MAFP) of East Timor, this project proposes to provide institutional strengthening to agro-technical schools in the country, by means of technical and educational training for teachers at these institutions, and to improve their curricular grades. **(P)**

Consolidation of Management and Education. With the involvement of the National Service of Industrial Learning (SENAI) and the Ministry of Education and Culture of Timor, this initiative aims to contribute towards the professional training of the Timorese population and support the technical, educational, and management consolidation of professionals at the Centre for Company Development, Professional formation and Social Advancement of East Timor. The cost to Brazil of this initiative is in the amount of US\$ 240,722.96. **(U)**

08) Business Development, Professional Qualification and Social Advancement in East Timor – Third Phase.

Within the same framework as the Second Phase described above, this present stage involves the same players, with costs to Brazil estimated at US\$ 763,368.00. **(P)**

09) Mission to Develop and Detail Technical Cooperation Projects

in East Timor. Pastoral da Criança. Coordinated by the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC.), and carried out by the Pastoral da Criança of Brazil and by the Office of the Prime Minister of East Timor, with Brazilian resources in the amount of US\$20,696.74, the objective of this initiative was to promote and reinforce the need for the transfer of methodologies from the Pastoral da Criança in Brazil, as well as to hold meetings with counterparts from East Timor, with the aim of promoting a greater understanding about the work of the Pastoral da Criança and obtain support for its activities. **(A)**

10) Support to Draft a General Electoral Law in East Timor.
