

HR Global UK Study Tour

The <u>ACU HR in HE Community</u> is inviting members to join a 12 day cross-institutional and cultural HR development programme for senior HR practitioners in higher education, run by <u>HR Global</u> Innovations.

The HR Global Study Tour will take place in the UK from 14-25 May 2018 and will include:

- Attendance to the <u>UHR (Universities Human Resources) Conference</u> in Bristol
- Field trips to selected national organisations in the UK, with briefings on the UK policy context and higher education leadership and initiatives that are driving current university HR initiatives. These include the <u>Universities and Colleges Employers Association (UCEA)</u> and the newly merged <u>Office for Students</u>.
- Visits to selected UK universities where participants will be provided with institutional briefings and case studies, demonstrating thought leadership and innovation in HR in the sector, and share ideas on future directions.

There will be a maximum of 20 delegates, accompanied by HR Global Innovations facilitators and mentors. It is expected that delegates will come from Australia, New Zealand, Canada, other Commonwealth countries and the Middle East.

The programme accommodates both group learning and individual goals and a high level of interactive participation through a mix of presentations, discussions, case studies, meetings and site visits. The programme is a two way learning experience where delegates will:

- Develop knowledge of higher education in an international context
- Learn about innovative Human Resource Management strategy and practice
- Exchange views and expertise with other participants in a global context
- Network with fellow HR practitioners and key players at the host universities
- Collectively work on institutional case studies and develop new thinking and approaches to solving specific HR or institutional problems
- Evaluate own practice against international standards
- Learn how HR departments in other institutions are organised, resourced and deal with specific HR challenges.

Registration fees

There are the following three options available:

Option 1: Full attendance for the 12-day programme, which will include attendance at the UHR Conference in Bristol, from the 22-25 May in Bristol, and site visits to the University of the Arts, London School of Economics, University of Liverpool, University of Lancaster, Nottingham Trent University, the University of Birmingham and a visit to the historic city of Bath on route between Birmingham and Bristol.

Option 2: ½ tour attendance for the first week of the tour (Monday 14 May - Friday 18 May), which will include site visits to the University of the Arts, London School of Economics, University of Liverpool, University of Lancaster and Nottingham Trent University.

Option 3: ½ tour attendance for the second week of the tour (Sunday 20 May - Friday 25 May), which will include attendance at the UHR conference in Bristol, a site visit to the University of Birmingham and a visit to the historic city of Bath on route between Birmingham and Bristol.

The costs of the 3 options (including single room accommodation, breakfast, dinner and travel between venues) are as follows:

The registration fee **does not** include travel to and from London and the home destination, as well as accommodation prior to and post the programme and on the nights of 18-19 May 2018, which will be free time for delegates.

HR Global application criteria

Applications will be assessed against the following criteria by the HR Global Innovations team:

- Currently working in a higher education institution with a well-developed HR function
- At least 10 years' experience in human resources, with a minimum of 4 years in a senior role, i.e. Director of HR (or equivalent), Deputy Director or Senior Manager, with responsibility for a diverse HR portfolio
- A breadth of experience across the HR function, including strategic planning, programme development and implementation
- Clearly articulated learning objectives from programme participation
- · Demonstrated support from senior institutional management

The application process

The closing date for registration is **13 April**.

Applicants will need to submit:

- 1. A **covering letter** of no more than 2 pages (excluding attachments) outlining:
 - A summary of your HR experience, qualifications and current career objectives

- A brief overview of your institution, including HR structure, resources and key strategic goals
- A brief description of your current role, including key accountabilities, achievements and challenges
- An outline of the areas you would be seeking to strengthen or develop through participation in the programme
- Potential case studies you could bring to the programme, e.g. successful recent initiatives or key challenges you are seeking to resolve.

(Attachments such as job descriptions, organisation charts, etc are recommended)

2. A full CV

3. A **letter of endorsement** from a member of the senior executive of your home institution articulating learning and career development expectations from the programme.
